

COURT TIME FOUNDATION
SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The Court Time Foundation intends to award an annual scholarship (providing fund availability) to a graduating high school senior who wishes to attend on a full-time basis an accredited college, university or junior college of their choice, and who are qualified students. A "qualified student" is an individual who:

- a). Has received, or is reasonably expected to receive, by June 30 of a given year, a high school diploma or a high school equivalency degree.
- b). Has enrolled, or has been accepted for enrollment, as a full-time student in an Educational Institution for the academic year commencing in which the Scholarship is to be awarded.
- c). Has a minimum cumulative 3.0 grade point average demonstrating academic proficiency; and
- d). Has participated in at least one (1) Court Time Sports Center, sports activity.

The following items must be completed for the application to be valid:

1. Written verification from your high school stating that you are expected to receive your high school diploma by June 30th in the year of which you are applying for this scholarship.
2. Written verification from your high school stating your current grade point average.
3. Three (3) letters of recommendation from your teacher, coach or similar mentor setting forth: a). the author's views on your integrity, leadership, dedication, team spirit, personal growth, skills and such other qualities that the author believes are relevant to the review of the scholarship application.

(All of the above MUST be sent directly from the authors to the Foundation. Reference providers must be at least 21 years of age. Letters written by the applicant's parents, legal guardians or relatives will not be accepted.)

4. A typed essay, which shall be no more that two (2) pages in length, and must be double-spaced. The essay should clearly indicate why you wish to attain a college/university or vocational degree, your career goals, as well as your personal insights about the need for the Scholarship. You may supply any information you believe is pertinent to the essay's importance. This essay must be attached to the application.

The Application Review Committee will review each application that meets the required criteria and will set up interviews with each applicant. The scholarship will be awarded by a majority vote.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION DEADLINE: MARCH 31

Scholarships will be awarded without regard to race, religion, ethnic origin or sex of the candidate. No Scholarship Recipient shall be a child or grandchild of a member of the Scholarship Review Committee or a spouse of such person.
